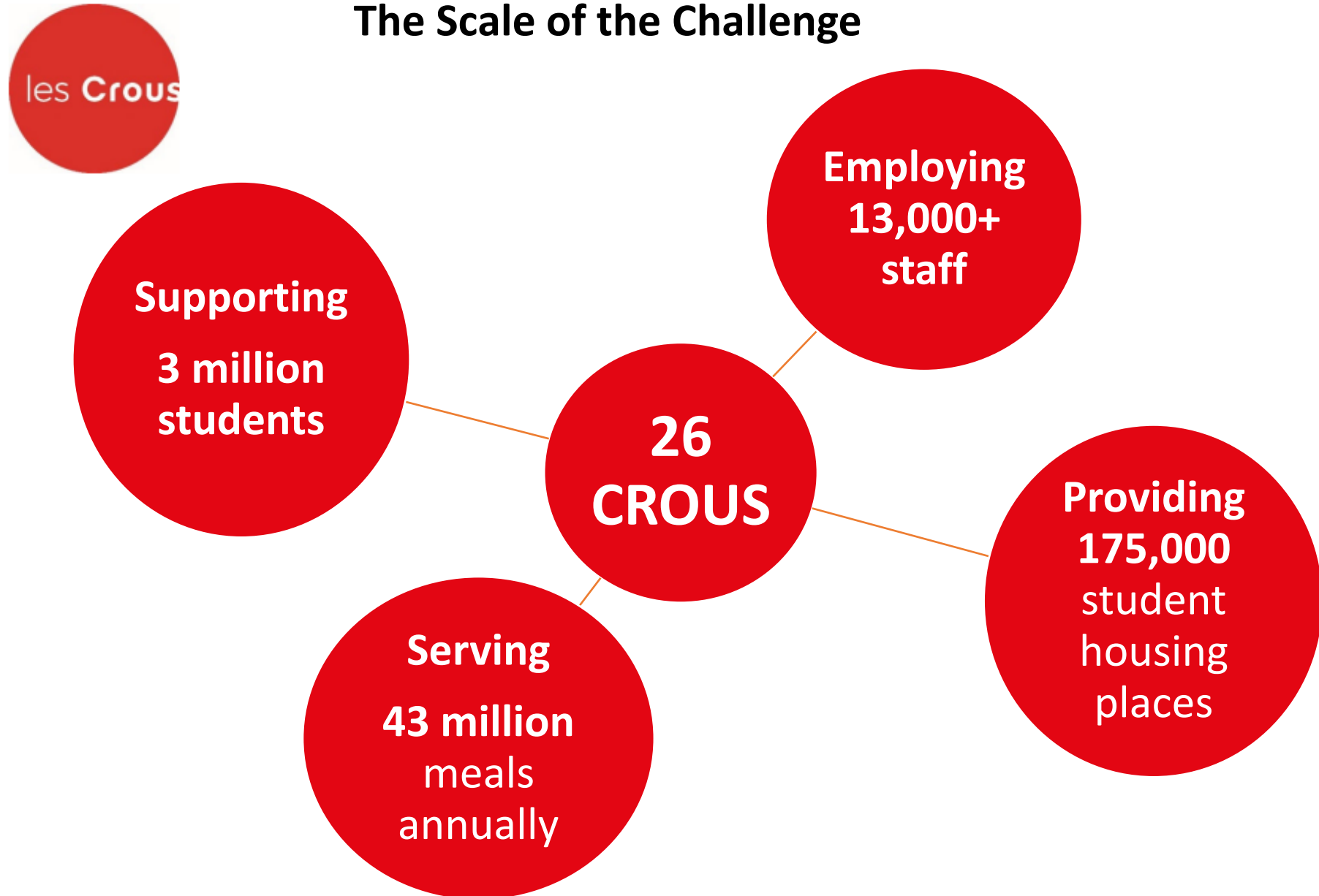

Why is this difficult ?

Four Structural Challenges

MEANS

- 3 million students VS 13 000 staff

VULNERABILITY

- Young adults in the making, often **isolated** and **unaware of their rights**

SCALE

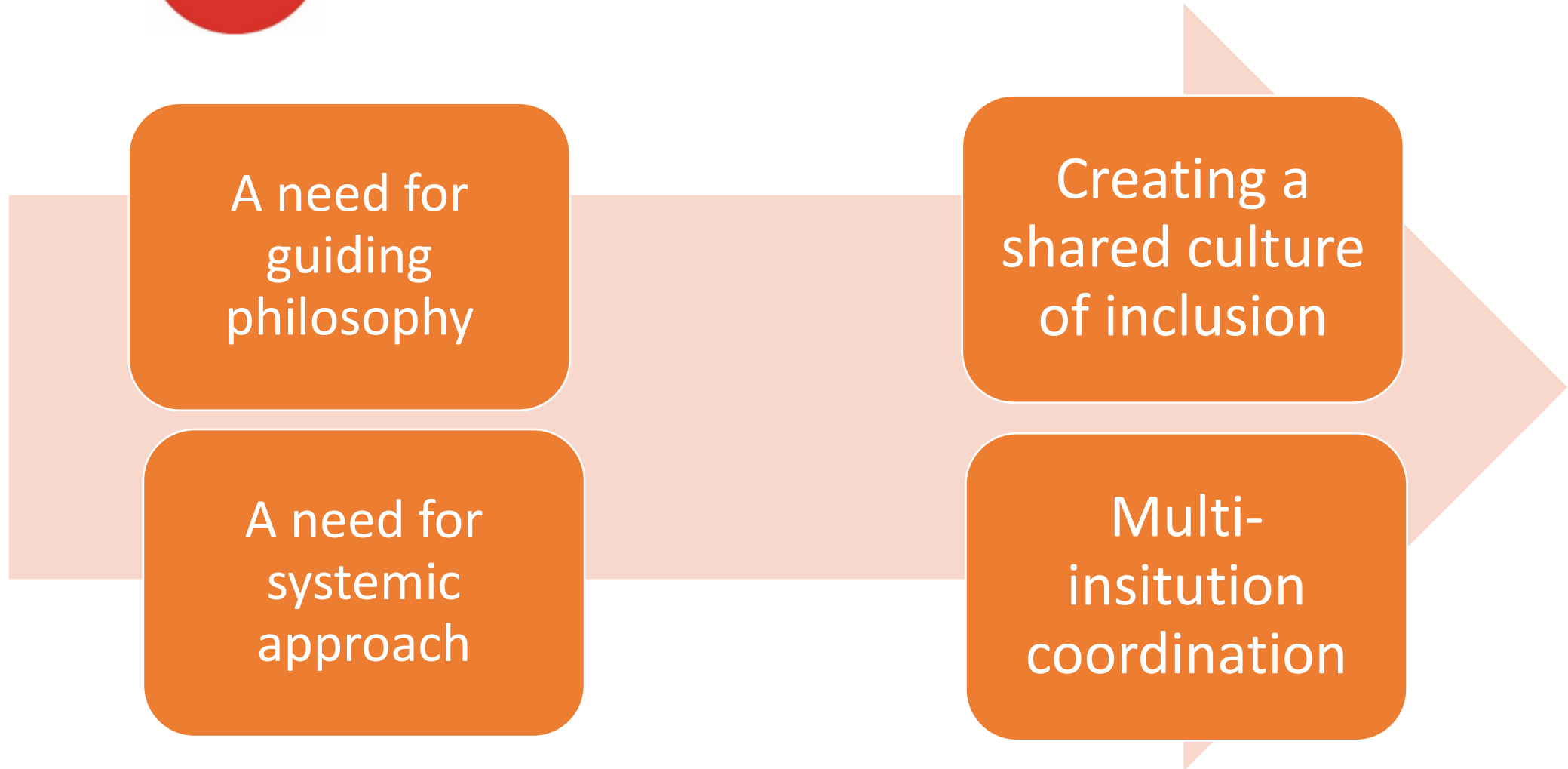
- 34% of students experienced or witnessed SGBV

MANDATE

- Crous support students but are **not their administrative authority**

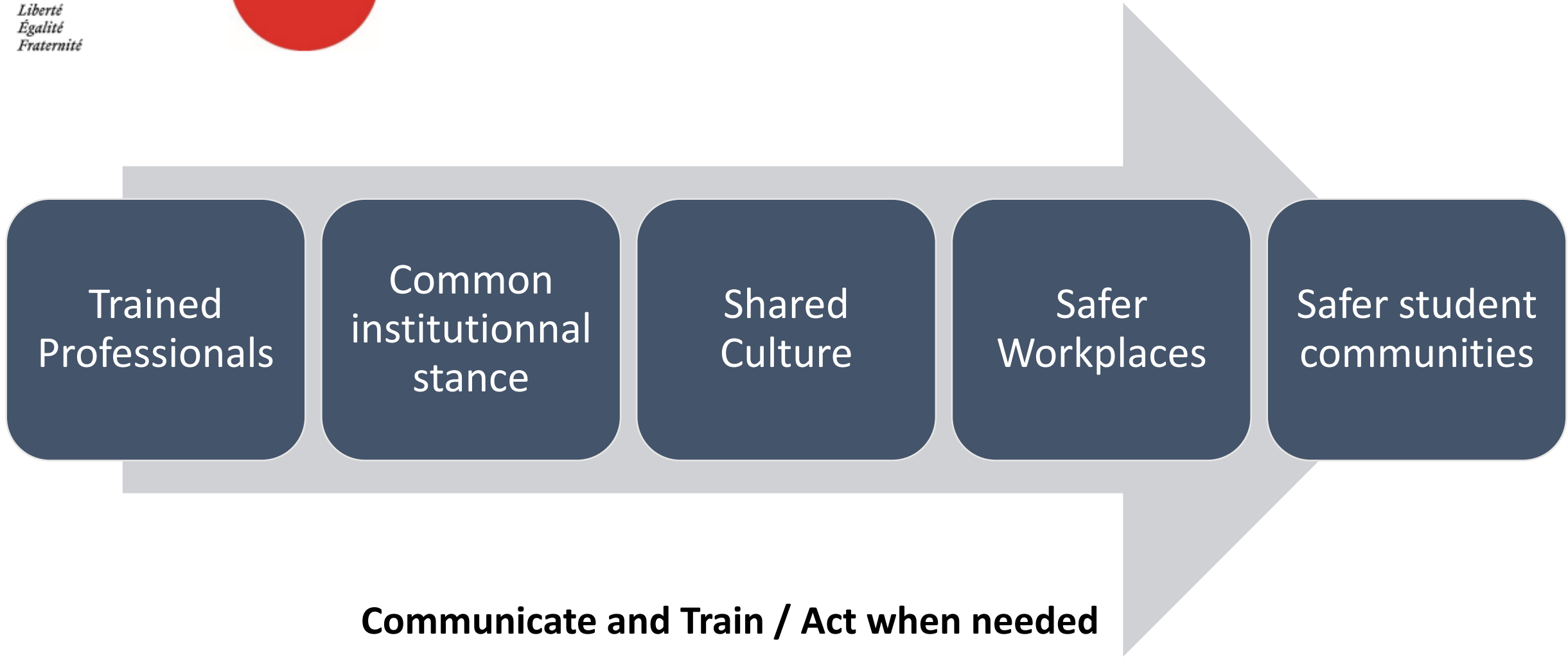
No institution can, nor should it try to, adress the challenge on their own

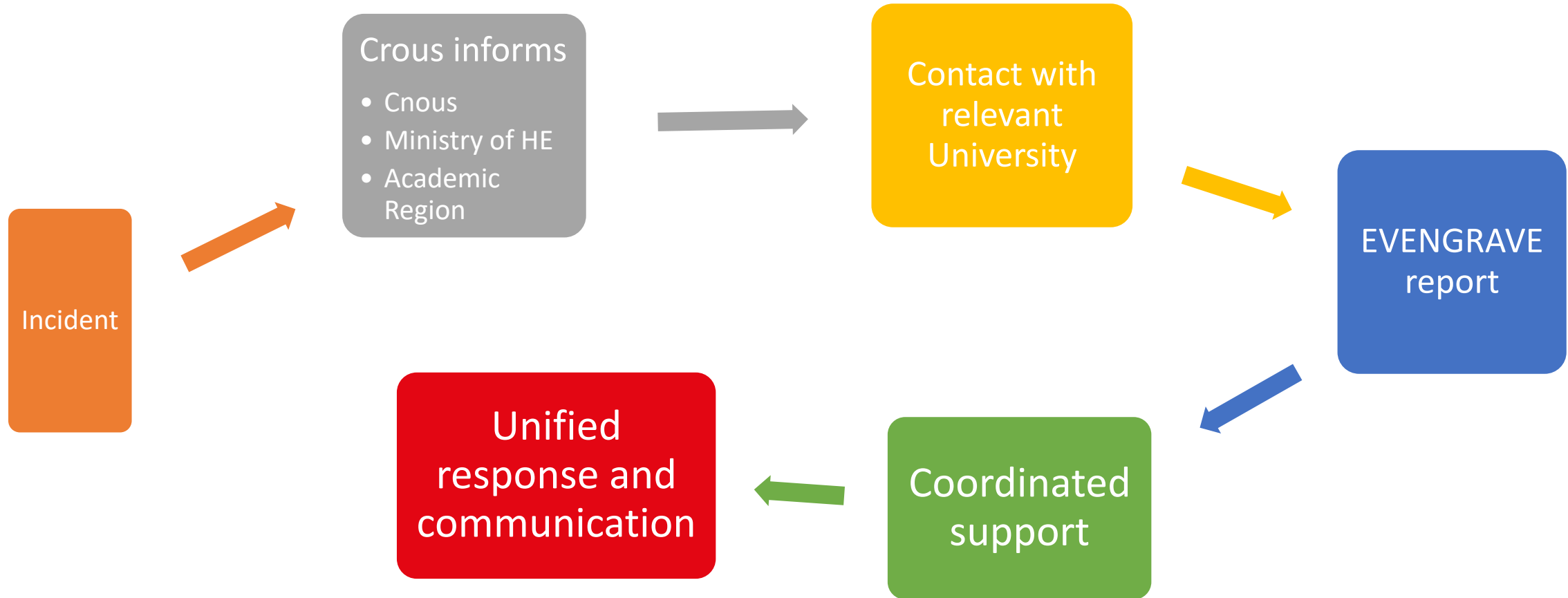

From reaction to coordination



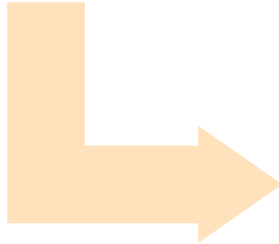

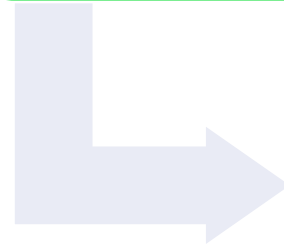
